After long-term follow-up half of people with schizophrenia have a favourable outcome while 16% have a delayed recovery after an early unremitting course. More usually, the course in the first two years predicted the long-term course. Early social intervention was also related to a better outcome.

Receipt of a follow-up visit within 30 days of discharge was associated with a slightly lower adjusted odds ratio (AOR) of hospital readmission during days 31–120 postdischarge (schizophrenia, AOR=.88, 95% confidence interval [CI]=.81–.96; bipolar disorder, AOR=.91, CI=.85–.98).
